Subject: Information Following Levee Encroachment Meeting on March 21, 2022

Dear Landowner,

Reclamation District No. 1600 held a joint meeting with Reclamation District No. 537 on March 21, 2022. At that meeting, staff from the Central Valley Flood Protection Board spoke in general about encroachments by private landowners onto the levees along the Sacramento River and the Yolo Bypass.

The Central Valley Flood Protection Board has the responsibility of regulating encroachments that may affect the federal flood control system built by the Army Corps of Engineers and maintained by the local maintaining authorities like Reclamation District No. 1600. The Central Valley Flood Protection Board is in the process of identifying encroachments within Reclamation District 1600. Once the encroachments are identified, you may be contacted by the District's engineers, MBK Engineers. There is no action for you to take at this time.

The purpose of this letter is to provide information to you. Enclosed are three brochures prepared by the Central Valley Flood Protection Board that explain the processes regarding levee encroachments.
